ice breaker	Have you ever adopted or fostered a pet? Share your experience, or if you haven't, what kind of pet would you consider adopting and why?
MAIN POINTS	 Like Millie the dog, we can all change. Trying to change through willpower alone often leads to failure A genuine encounter with Jesus leads to a relationship which leads to change. Religious self absorption leads to "external conformity" rather than "internal change" Our behaviors are our beliefs put into action
DISCUSS	 What most stood our to you from the message this weekend? Why? How do you typically respond to change in your life? Do you tend to resist it or embrace it? Do you believe people can change? Why or why not? Have you seen it in your own life? Where? Read Philippians 2:5-8. What strikes you about Jesus' example of humility? How can we practically apply this mindset in our daily lives? Pastor Cal shared that transformation comes through relationship. What rhythms do you have or practice to maintain a relationship with Jesus? What's the difference between trying to change through willpower versus through a relationship with Christ?
NEXT STEP	What's one specific way you can put others before yourself this week, following Jesus' example?
SCRIPTURE	2 Corinthians 5:17 Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here! Philippians 2:5-8 In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus: Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage; rather, he made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death— even death on a cross!
