 BIG IDEA	All faith is fragile until it's been tested by fire.

Have you personally experienced this? How did you overcome that and forgive?4. Is deconstructing your faith a bad thing? Why or Why not?
 FOR STUDENTS	What are some of the reasons that people you know have struggled with their faith or deconstructed?
 CHALLENGE	Who around you is in the process of deconstructing their faith? How can you support them in love?
